The tactile, oyster-shell texture and saline acidity are the hallmarks of this parcel.

The wine speaks with authority and calmness - the voice of the Limeworks block.







The Shelf (Long Rows) 1998-2008

Plant density of 11,363v/ha at 1.1m row & 0.8m vine spacing. Soil pit - Waikari soils clay loam topsoil grading to a chalky subsoil & calcareous glauconitic sandstone rich in Fe & Mg



North Arm C – density at 12,987 – 18,181 v/ha with Melanic Soils

Black or dark grey well-structured topsoil, rich in calcium &/or magnesium - high natural fertility and alkaline soil pHs. The underlying rock forms a physical barrier, but roots & water make their way through the cracks.



The Roadblock Timpendean soils

Olive yellow to green coloured glauconitic sediments - from unconsolidated sandstones to calcareous mudstones with high density calcareous clays

On Bell Hill – Shelf 1998 (Left) & Shelf West 2009 (Right)



The upper third of this block are predominantly Timpendean soils, soil profile classes Tm4 – Tm2, and in the lower two thirds predominantly Waikari soils, soil profile classes Wk4 – Wk5 – Wk6. Soil Wk6 formed from calcareous sandstone and therefore has a sandy subsoil.
