

2022 Vintage - Marlborough

A typically warm October, November and December allowed for sound fruit set, however an unusually cold and wet February increased the potential for disease pressure and delayed ripening, threatening a successful harvest.

Thankfully a dry and warm period from late February until late March allowed us to pick Chardonnay and Pinot Noir at Isabel Estate in an ideal harvest window, with Chardonnay in excellent fruit condition- however was a tougher ripening/picking period for Pinot Gris and Sauvignon Blanc.



Sub-Regional Differentiation

Isabel Estate

Confluence of Southern Valleys and Wairau Valley - north side Omaka River, very cold site, sometimes 2c colder than Te Whare Ra 500m to the north, soils medium loam over clay/gravel mix. Elevation 60m. Rainfall 795mm.

Taylors Pass

Awatere Valley - north side Awatere River - Elevated river terrace, high wind run, inland -no coastal influence, shorter growing season, soils - Shallow stony loam/stony silt, over greywacke, immature recent soils. Elevation 96m. Rainfall 665mm.

Microclimate key to both sites - can be significant diurnal flux - acidity retention - creation of wines with concentration and energy








Clonal Variation & Viticulture

Isabel Estate - Mendoza 100%

- Significant hen and chicken loose bunch architecture, traditionally low crop,
- Block 3 farmed organically
- Block 1 mechanically weeded, organic in conversion
- Compost application made on site Bi -annual to date

Taylors Pass - Clone 95 100% - conventionally sprayed

• A typical Chardonnay blend in a white burgundy may contain varying portions of Clone 95, 548 and the 1000 series - 1066-68 - more like Isabel Estate Single Vineyard Blend as opposed to Isabel Estate Wild Barrique based solely on mendoza

NZ Chardonnay wines have tended to rely on Mendoza, B95, UCD 6/15 and the newer Entav 548 - all of which Isabel Estate farms

Mendoza Clone

- The Mendoza Clone was imported from CSIRO Australia by David Sheat in 1971
- Mendoza yields low to moderate crops of medium clusters, prone to some hen and chicken formation. Therefore, produces rich and intense wines.
- It was and still is for many the preferred clone for premium Chardonnay
- Are we working with Mendoza variants?



Clone 95

- Popular clone capable of producing excellent wines of weight, balance & complexity
- Productive, rather large, tight conicalshaped bunches that can become susceptible to rot
- Imported by Allan Clarke for NZGVIG (1988) directly from Prof. Raymond Bernard (ONIVINS Dijon, Burgundy)
